INDIANNESS IN NAYI KAVITA

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Indianness , means not only nationality rather literary sensibility in a very holistic manner.Navi kavita, the very nomenclature is given by S.H. Vatsyayan Agyeya and pivotal personality of this post independence literary movement was Gajanan Madhav Muktibodh. Former was nonmarxist whereas later was hard hitted Marxist but ideologically they were deeply rooted in Indian culture and Indian philosophy. Though inspired by T.S.Eliot.Ezra Pound, Mathew Arnold, Romand Rolla, Albert Camus, D.H.Lawrence, Turgenev, Sigmund Freud, Kierkegaard karl Yaspers etc. AGYEYA never forgot our culture. Certainly he was a nomadic man but in his nomadism there is a deep tinge of INDIANNESS.He always believes in openness Let noble thoughts come from every side; be it Gandhism, be it Existentialism, be it Expressionism, be it Symbolism and the stream of consciousness; Agyeya took every thing from every ideas but didn't dissolve himself into that rather all ideologies have been dissolved in to his personality. This is what we call indinness in navi kavita. Muktibodh is the pioneer of this movement. He is extreme leftist but ideas of a common never float like oil on the water but it is just like a fragrance hidden in a flower. He refused elitism. He advocated the *mukti* of a common man of the society. After getting independence it was observed that every thing would be for the betterment of the people but in a very short span of time people felt MOHBHANGA from everything i.e.values, politics, lives and emotions. In true sense Muktibodh awakened the common man of India, in this sense there is a spirit of indianness in Nayi kavita
